## About Us

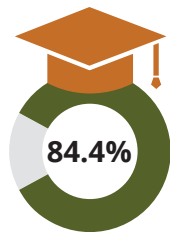

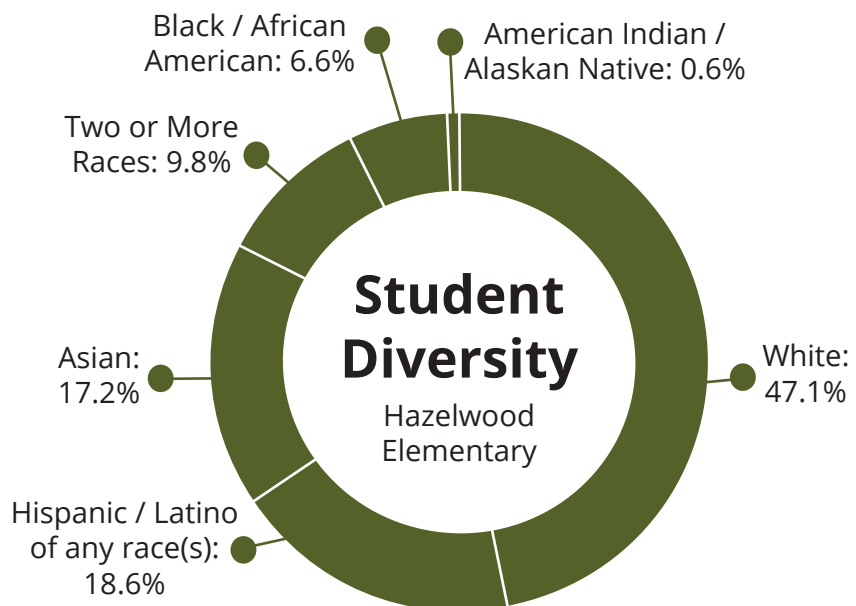

## Academic Accomplishments and Goals Strategic Direction Focus Areas

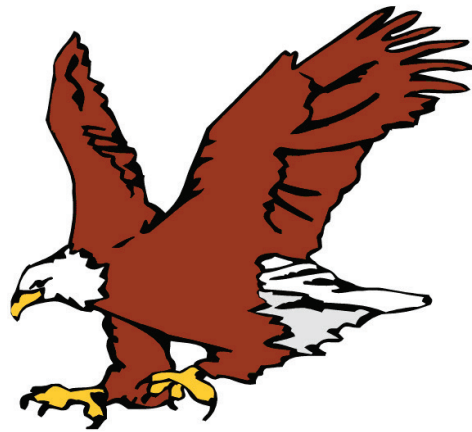

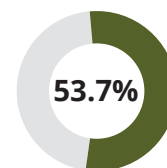

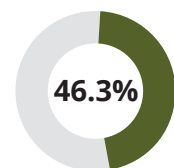


### **State Assessments**
