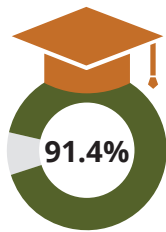

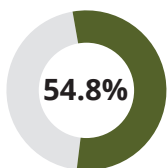

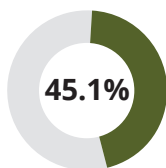


## State Assessments

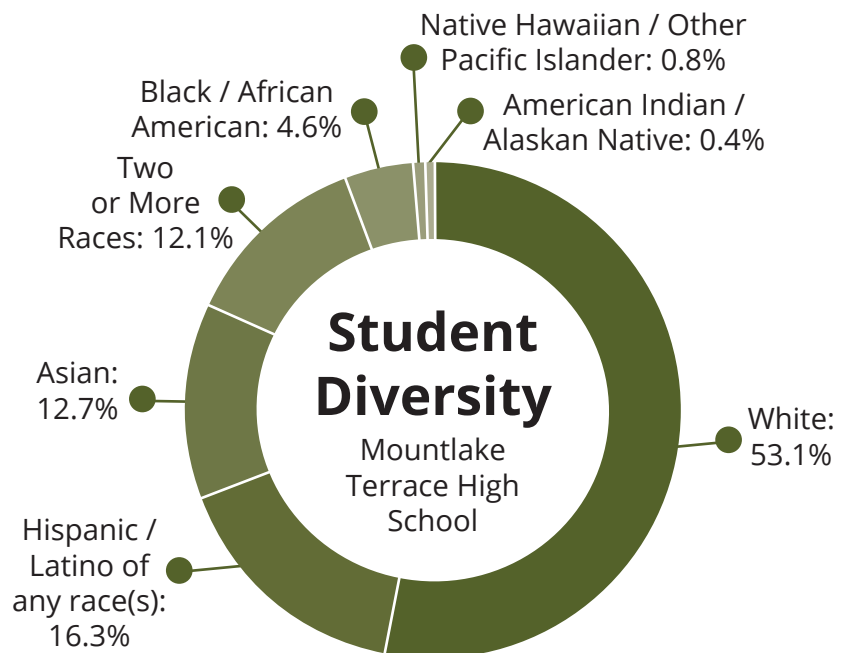

All teachers will actively engage in the Professional development activities as part of the School Improvement Plan

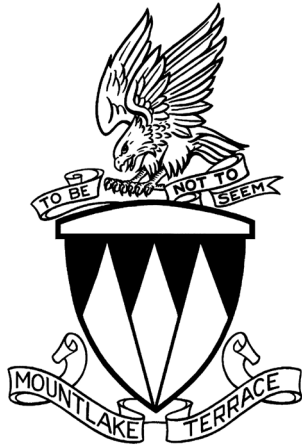
- Teachers will collaborate with case managers for students with IEPs, before school and throughout the school year. It is believed that when general education teachers know and understand the goals of their students with IEPs better, they are more able to provide accommodations and anticipate supports needed in their lessons.
- Teachers will implement strategies that are learned in professional development. PD skills training will be presented in the areas of literacy support (for students that read below grade level), writing support, organizational strategies and work completion.

- Teachers will implement learned strategies for differentiating assignments, differentiating assessments and providing accommodated options for students that are aligned to their goals in their written IEPs
- Teachers will use classroom assessment data to develop specific targeted interventions

and determine/implement the best instructional strategies to support struggling students and enable all students to master the standards in their classes.

All students will improve their attendance

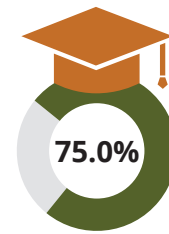
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## How You Can Help
