Collection of Evidence (COE) Classes

COST: FREE

COE courses offered:

- Algebra
- Reading
- Writing
- Biology

The Collection of Evidence (COE) is an alternate way to meet the state testing requirement for juniors and seniors who have taken the state test twice (EOC for math (Alg/Geom), or Biology; HSPE for Reading or Writing). Students who have attempted the state test only once may take a summer COE class, but the COE will not be submitted until after the student has taken the test again. In this course, students will complete a set of 6-8 work samples to submit to the state for scoring. The state score will determine if the student meets standard in that area. COEs are submitted in January for seniors and in June for juniors. Students not fully completing their set of tasks will have to continue the work back at their home school in the fall.

Students who successfully complete this course will receive 1/2 credit in the corresponding subject area (Pass/Fail).

Course Offerings

The high school courses satisfy specific high school graduation requirements. Students successfully completing one-half credit courses will have received 57 hours of classroom instruction.

* On a space-available basis, students may register for summer school for grade replacement with the approval of the secondary summer school principal.

Courses below are intended for credit retrieval only.

MATH

Remedial Mathematics (DMA 100)

Grades 7-8 - \$175.00

This course takes students at their appropriate level and moves individually through topics as students master one unit after another. (Not open to students who have passed Algebra 1/2.)

Algebra 1 (MAT 202)

Grades 9-12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

This course is for students who have mastered basic computational skills. The course offers an opportunity to learn how to perform computations of real numbers, solve equations and inequalities, graph equations and inequalities, solve systems of equation, and apply equations in solving story problems.

Algebra 2 (MAT 252)

Grades 9-12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

Equipment needed: A graphing calculator (TI-83 Plus, or better). Second year Algebra builds on the concepts learned in Algebra 1 and Geometry and further develops the mathematical manipulations needed to solve more complex equations and simulation. Students will study linear, quadratic, logarithmic and trigonometric functions; inequalities, absolute value real and imaginary numbers. Learning demonstrations will include homework, class participation, quizzes, tests and projects.

Geometry (MAT 302)

Grades 9-12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

This course emphasizes deductive reasoning as well as studying lines, angles, triangles and circles. These are studied with respect to congruence, similarity, etc.

SPECIAL EDUCATION

Special Education English

(ZEN 102 / 202 / 302 / 402)

Grades 9-12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

A structured reading class for struggling readers on an Individual Education Plan (IEP). Courses with less than 13 students may be cancelled.

Special Education Math (ZMA 062)

Grades 9-12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

For students who have math goals on their Individual Education Plans (IEPs). Courses with less than 13 students may be cancelled.

ENGLISH

English (DEN 700/800)

Grades 7-8 - \$175.00

Geared to the individual's pace and needs. The course reviews grammar usage, punctuation, spelling, and the mechanics of the writing process.

English (ENG 102/202/302/402)

Grades 9-12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

These courses emphasize the fundamentals of writing, speaking and reading. (These courses satisfy graduation requirements for grades 9, 10, 11 and 12.)

SOCIAL STUDIES

United States History (DSS 850)

Grade 7 & 8 - \$175.00

Includes United States History through the Civil War, the founding and structure of government, and the rights and responsibilities of individuals.

9th Grade World History (SOC 101)

Grade 9 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

Includes regional studies in Latin American studies, Middle Eastern studies, Southeast Asia studies, culture and geography.

10th Grade World History (SOC 202)

Grade 10 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

Includes studies of international conflicts, challenges to democracy and human rights, and the emergence and development of new nations.

United States History (SOC 302)

Grade 11 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

Includes studies of the United States from the post-Civil War era to the present.

Senior Social Studies – Government, Economics & Global Issues (SOC 422)

Grade 12 (1/2 Credit) - \$250.00

Includes studies on civics, economics and contemporary world issues.

ELL summer school courses will be counted for high school credit.

These classes are for in-district students only and tuition cost is covered by scholarships. There is a materials fee of \$25.00.

ELL Beginning I (ELL 092)

This class is for current ELL middle or high school students with limited English language skills. **Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.**

ELL Intermediate (ELL 202)

An intensive reading and writing course. This class is for current ELL middle or high school students. **Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.**

ELL Advanced (ELL 302)

An intensive reading and writing course. This class is for current ELL middle or high school students. **Enrollment is limited to 20 per class.**

Physical Education Exploring Outdoor Recreation and Fitness

(PHE 250/252) **Grades 9-12
(1/2 Credit) - \$350.00**

Exploring Outdoor Recreation and Fitness

This is an opportunity to capture a half a credit of P.E. in just two weeks and still have a full summer off. This course will explore outdoor recreational activities that are available right in our own backyard. The goal of this course is to introduce and familiarize students with a variety of outdoor activities that they may take interest in beyond the course. Basic concepts and instruction will be given in activities such as golf, tennis, hiking, biking, walking/running, and other various forms of outdoor fitness. Students will also explore aspects of healthy eating to maximize their health and fitness. Some equipment will be provided, but students may use their own as well.
