Community

The city of Lynnwood is 15 miles north of Seattle and 12 miles south of Everett. Lynnwood is one of the largest cities in Snohomish County with a population of 33,140 and is a large retail center. The Boeing Company is the county's largest employer.

Lynnwood High School

Lynnwood High School is one of four comprehensive high schools in the Edmonds School District. Lynnwood High School serves a diverse population of approximately 1400 students, including students representing 29 countries and 21 languages in our ELL program. We also work with students with multiple disabilities served through the district's Life Skills Program. The school year is 180 days and is comprised of two 18-week semesters. Six, 50-minute classes meet each day. The school day begins at 7:00 am with a 20 minute tutorial period, which allows students to meet with their teachers for extra help when needed. A 25 minute period is set aside each day for teacher-student interaction in an Advisory class. Lynnwood High School is especially proud of its diversity and acceptance of all students for their contributions to the community.

Curriculum

Lynnwood High School offers Advanced Placement (AP) courses in Language and Composition, Literature and Composition, United States History, European History, Calculus AB and BC, Statistics, Computer Science, Chemistry, Biology, Physics, Environmental Science, French, Spanish, 2d Design, and American Government. Honors level courses are offered in the areas of English, Mathematics, History, and Science. Lynnwood High School rewards motivated students by weighting AP (5.0 scale) and Honors (4.5 scale) courses for purposes of internal class ranking. College credit is also offered through our Tech Prep program for certain technical courses and through the College in the High School program.
