

# South County Emergency Cold Weather Shelter Could Be OPEN Starting November 1



**From November 1 – March 31**, when temperatures fall to freezing for extended periods overnight, volunteers will open the South County Cold Weather Shelter and provide men, women and children with a warm and safe place overnight. Dinner, breakfast and a sack lunch to go will be provided.

## **How do I know when the Cold Weather Shelter is open?** (Info updated daily by 10:00am)

## **When the shelter is open, how does it work?**

### \* Transportation provided from 2 locations

- **7:00pm** in front of Lynnwood City Hall (building next to the Library)
- **7:05pm** at bus stop next to Trader Joes (196<sup>th</sup> St and Highway 99)
- Transportation back to City Hall the following morning at 7:00am

### \* Guests are checked into the shelter which includes:

- **Signing a Guest Agreement** that you will follow the rules of the shelter
- **Bags are searched** by a volunteer to keep everyone safe in the shelter
- **Strict enforcement of “NO Alcohol, Drugs or Weapons policy”** (if any of these are found, Guests must leave the shelter immediately - NO transportation back to Lynnwood provided)
